## 2. The IMPACT project framework

- 7th Framework Programme of the EC (FP7)
- Coordinated by the Koninklijke Bibliotheek, Netherlands
- Duration 4 years (2008 2011)
- 4 subprojects (Operational Context, Text Recognition, Enhancement & Enrichment, and Capacity Building)
- 2 phases
- Now:
  - 26 institutions from 13 EU countries
  - 12 libraries
  - 12 research institutes and universities
  - 2 commercial companies








## 9. NUK – library in modern information society

- More than 1 million of distant users












## 10. Digital Library of Slovenia – dLib.si





IMPACT = closed network - Centre of Competence for digitisation










## 17. Europeana vs. IMPACT

- **Active participation of end-users**






